

Bio Hazardous or Trauma Scene Clean Up

Please be aware that if a crime or trauma scene needs to be cleaned up, legislation requires that *specialty trained and equipped personnel* must *clean up* and *dispose of* bio hazardous materials in a regulated manner. Bio hazardous substances could include bodies, blood and other body fluids.

This means that you, your family, your employees, or regular janitorial service cannot handle or dispose of these substances.

If a bio hazardous scene exists on or in a rental property, contact the landlord. If you own the property, contact your insurance agent.

Always check with the police before authorizing any cleanup at a crime or trauma scene. If an investigation is ongoing, cleanup may be delayed.

Please be aware that Victim Services does not provide funding for this clean up.
